GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES MIXED WEDNESDAY, AS WHEAT AND CORN PRICES ADVANCED AND BEAN PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY. WHEAT STEADY TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT SO. IOWA 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. NEW CONTRACT HIGHS WERE SET IN WHEAT PITS, INDUCED BY NEWS CIS WILL RECEIVE ADDITIONAL OR FEBRUARY. OTHER VERY GOOD FOREIGN EXPORT WHEAT DEMAND ADDED STRENGTH TO WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES REGAINED SOME OF TUESDAY'S LOSSES AS TRADERS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT ADDITIONAL FOOD AID REPORTS FOR COMMONWEALTH OF INDEPENDENT STATES. PRICE ADVANCES, HOWEVER, WERE LIMITED BY LACK OF RECENT GOOD EXPORT ORDERS. BEAN PRICES DROPPED BACK SLIGHTLY IN DISAPPOINTMENT OVER TIME SCHEDULE FOR CIS CREDITS. BENEFICIAL RAINS FORECAST BY THIS WEEKEND IN BRAZIL'S BEAN PRODUCING REGIONS, ALSO WEAKENED BEAN PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: JAPANESE FOOD AGENCY BOUGHT 104,800 TONNES WHEAT FOR MARCH SHIPMENT. EGYPT BOUGHT 8,000 TONNES COTTONSEED OIL UNDER THE COTTONSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR FEBRUARY SHIPMENT.
