

48 Angus Lots Average \$4,405

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — The 1992 National Western Angus Bull Sale in Denver saw 48 lots average \$4,405.

Sale consignments competed in a sale bull show prior to the sale. Judges for the event were Bob Cook, Billings, Montana; Ben Eggers, Mexico, Missouri; Miles Groseth, North Platte, Nebraska; Dale Grubbs, Hillsboro, Indiana; and Bill Marsden, Highmore, South Dakota.

Grand champion honors were presented to Whitestone Tonto 0133 exhibited by Whitestone Farm, Aldie, Virginia. The September 1990 bull is a son of Leachman Tonto. The grand winner sold

for \$12,600 to Flying A Angus Ranch, Lompoc, California.

The reserve grand champion bull was AF Wader exhibited by Forsythe Cattle Co., Marshall, Illinois. The April 1990 bull is a son of Northcote Excitement. The reserve grand bull sold to University of Nevada - Reno for \$5,000.

The top-selling bull was Thomas Reality purchased by the Reality Syndicate for \$20,500. Consignor of that top lot was Thomas Angus Ranch, Baker, Oregon.

Among the other top sellers were Premier Smash consigned by Premier Angus, Cloverdale, Indiana, sold to Smash Associates,

Cloverdale, Indiana, for \$10,000; Walls Prompter 034 consigned by Wall Angus Farm, Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, sold to Mt. Rushmore Angus, Rapid City, South Dakota, for \$10,000; Landmark Mac Kenzie 9107 consigned by Landmark Cattle Co., Whitehall, Montana, sold to Clark Angus, Houston, Texas, for \$8,500.

A featured consignment was the pick of the grand champion pen of three bulls exhibited by Ankony Angus, Minatare, Nebraska. Cottonwood Angus Farm, Pipestone, Minnesota, took its pick, Ankonian Asteroid 235A, for \$8,000.
