**SRBC Hears
 Requests For
 Water Use**

HARRISBURG
 (Dauphin Co.) — The
 Susquehanna River
 Basin Commission met
 Jan. 23 at the Robert J.
 Bielo Building in
 Harrisburg.

At this meeting, the
 commission heard:

- Reports on the sta-
 tus of storage realloca-
 tion studies at the Cur-
 wensville, Raystown
 and East Sidney Reser-
 voirs, and on the prog-
 ress made in obtaining
 buyers for Curwensville
 storage.
- Approved a Section
 319(h) grant application
 totalling \$115,900 for a
 two-year study assess-
 ing nutrient sources,
 concentrations and
 loads in the Armstrong
 Creek Basin, Dauphin
 County.
- Selected the audit-
 ing firm of Boyer & Rit-
 ter for the next three fis-
 cal year audits.
- Approved an inter-
 governmental personnel
 agreement for the tem-
 porary utilization of the
 service of USGS Hydro-
 logist, H. N. Flippo.
- Following a public
 hearing, adopted the
 Lackawanna River
 Flood Protection Pro-
 jects into the SRBC
 Comprehensive Plan.
- Reviewed several
 pieces of correspon-
 dence sent out and
 received by the
 Commission.
- And acted on pro-
 ject applications for
 Armitage Golf Club, the
 Arundel Corporation
 and the State College
 Borough Water
 Authority.

The commission also
 held a public hearing on
 the Curwensville water
 Storage Reallocation
 Project. The hearing
 record will be held open
 until Feb. 24, 1992, for
 those who wish to sub-
 mit any written com-
 ments on this project.
 The next meeting of
 the commission is tenta-
 tively set for March 12,
 1992, at the Robert J.
 Bielo Building in
 Harrisburg.
