## **SRBC** Hears Requests For

Water Use

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Susquehanna River Basin Commission met Jan. 23 at the Robert J. Bielo Building in Harrisburg.

At this meeting, the commission heard:

• Reports on the status of storage reallocation studies at the Curwensville, Raystown and East Sidney Reservoirs, and on the progress made in obtaining buyers for Curwensville storage.

• Approved a Section 319(h) grant application totalling \$115,900 for a two-year study assessing nutrient sources, concentrations and loads in the Armstrong Creek Basin, Dauphin County.

• Selected the auditing firm of Boyer & Ritter for the next three fiscal year audits.

 Approved an intergovernmental personnel agreement for the temporary utilization of the service of USGS Hydrologist, H. N. Flippo.

• Following a public hearing, adopted the Lackawanna River Flood Protection Projects into the SRBC Comprehensive Plan.

• Reviewed several pieces of correspondence sent out and received by the Commission.

• And acted on project applications for Armitage Golf Club, the Arundel Corporation and the State College Borough Water Authority.

The commission also held a public hearing on the Curwensville water Storage Reallocation Project. The hearing record will be held open until Feb. 24, 1992, for those who wish to submit any written comments on this project.

The next meeting of the commission is tentatively set for March 12, 1992, at the Robert J. Bielo Building in Harrisburg.
