NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower in the Midwest and the North Atlantic areas, and unchanged elsewhere. The market tone continued barely steady to weak. Demand in all channels remained poor to moderate, occasionally better where featured. Supplies were adequate to weak. Breakers were unaggressive buyers of extra shell eggs, and prices continued to drop. Finished product sales were light, and for immediate needs only. Live hen markets were at least steady, and offerings were light to adequate for the moderate to good demand.

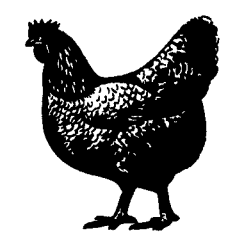
