

President Marvin Brown oversaw the meeting.

Jeffrey and Mary Kay Roche of New Oxford received thanks for directing the sale of 65 cases of cheddar cheese, a fund-raising project. Proceeds are targeted to support the dairy princess program, help underwrite dairy product promotion, and provide assistance to programs for youth. Responsibility for the next cheese



sale will be shared by Adam and Vincent Lobaugh plus Jeffrey King.

Reservations with a \$10 down payment are due by March 15th, for a dairy tour into York County on April 9. Accepting the recommendations of Jennie Hess, extension dairy agent, the tour is to depart Adams County at 8 a.m. to make stops at McRal Dairy Farm of Ralph McGregor; Smysers Richlawn Farm, and Sinking Springs Farm before lunch at Rutters Family Restaurant.

Afternoon visits to Bupplyn Farms south of York and Susquehanna Aquacultures, Inc. at York Haven will allow the group to return to Gettysburg about 4:30 p.m. Adam Lobaugh is chair of the tour committee.




