WHEAT PRICES RECOVERED SOME OF TUESDAY'S DRASTIC LOSSES AS COMMERCIAL BUYING AND SHORT COVERINGS ON THE BOARD SUPPORTED PRICES. RECENT VERY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND AND NEWS, EGYPT AND SRI LANKA HAVE REBID FOR U.S. EXPORT BONUS WHEAT, ADDED TO PRICE GAINS. 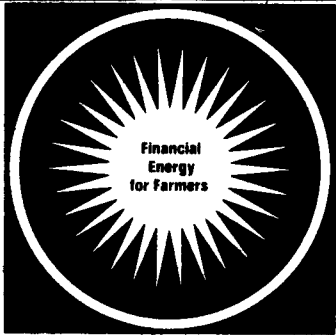
