UDS President Objects To Milk Pricing Changes

SENECA FALLS, N.Y. — The president of a Seneca Falls, N.Y.-based dairy pricing organization has written to the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture in an effort to eliminate a new pricing category for milk in two federal milk orders.

Edward D. Anna, president of United Dairy Services, sent a letter to Agriculture Secretary Edward Madigan to express his concern that the Secretary's decision to amend Federal Milk Orders #1 and

#4 to include a new Class IIIA price will create a severe disruption in the movement of milk supplies from farm to market.

Anna, who is also an independent milk marketing consultant, said that milk buyers in Orders 1 and 4 are seeking supplies of milk from Order 2 dairies to put into large powder plants in those federal orders for the sole purpose of taking advantage of the change in the new Class IIIA price, not

because of a surplus situation or lack of plant capacity in Order 2.

He said he sees many Order 2 dairy producers being encouraged to transfer out of that order and into Orders 1 and 4 in an effort to fill "surplus" powder plants, merely to take advantage of the order amendment, not because of consumer demand.

The result could be that Order 2 plants, in order not to lose their supplies of raw milk, would be

forced to pay premiums not warranted by consumer demand for their products.

In addition, Anna said the implementation of a Class IIIA price for milk utilized in the manufacture of non-fat dry milk powder will lower the blend price now paid to the dairy farmers in the orders that adopt this measure.

Milk used to manufacture non-fat, dry milk powder is currently assigned to Class II which yields a higher return to the dairy farmer.

Anna said, "If the industry is going to have a milk price that is tied to the consumer/commodity prices like this new Class IIIA price, then it should apply to the entire country, not a few selected orders."






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
