EXPORT NEWS PUSHED WHEAT PRICES SHARPLY HIGHER WEDNESDAY; CORN AND BEAN PRICES FELL ON FUND LONG LIQUIDATION. WHEAT 3 TO 14 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT GULF 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES MOVED SHARPLY HIGHER ON TALKS INDIA COULD TENDER FOR 1 MILLION TONNES OF OPTIONAL-ORIGIN WHEAT AS EARLY AS NEXT WEEK. NEWS ALSO, USDA IS UNLIKELY TO OPEN ITS 147 MILLION BUSHELS FOOD SECURITY RESERVE FOR WHEAT, ADDED TO GAINS IN PRICES. USDA RELEASED FIGURES SHOWING PRODUCERS ARE TAKING AN AVERAGE OF 4 MILLION BUSHELS A WEEK OUT OF THE SEPARATE FARMER-OWNED RESERVE, WHICH AS OF FEBRUARY 18 TOTALED 98.2 MILLION BUSHELS. AT THIS RATE, STOCKS ARE FORECAST TO FALL TO 40 MILLION BUSHELS BY THE END OF 91/92 MARKETING YEAR ON MAY 31. SLACK IN EXPORT DEMAND PRESSURED CORN AND BEAN PRICES ALONG WITH FUND LIQUIDATION ON THE BOARD. SOYBEANS ALSO CAME UNDER PRESSURE FROM REPORTS, BRAZIL WILL SOON BEGIN HARVEST OF ITS LARGE BEAN CROP.
