OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Feeder steers over 650 lbs. and all heifers \$1.00- \$3.00 lower. Stocker steers under 650 lbs. firm. Demand fairly good for yearling feeder cattle at the lower levels. Very good demand for grazing cattle. Quality of supply average to attractive. Flesh conditions not extreme for wheat cattle and typical for March; caule in average through moderately fleshy condition. Buyers exhibited very little price discrimination between these differences in wheat flesh. Weigh ups attractive to buyers as cold rain Sunday night and Monday kept many cattle in gaunt to average weigh condition. Slaughter cows steady for the week. Slaughter bulls \$2.00 higher. Cow and bull demand good.

Large receipts prior to March indicates quickly maturing wheat; fast growth has created some bloating or wheat poisoning problems, hastening marketing in many cases. Receipts this week 17,213; last week 12,945; last year 13,928. Supply consisted of 78 percent yearlings; 19 percent calves and stockers under 600 lbs.; and 3 percent cows and bulls. 


