WHEAT PRICES CONTINUE LOWER WEDNESDAY; CORN AND BEAN PRICES UP FROM YESTER-DAY'S SLUMP. WHEAT STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT ST. LOUIS 1 CENT HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM STEADY TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 7 TO 11 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES EXTENDED TUESDAY'S LOS-SES, DESPITE GOOD EXPORT ORDERS. MAY FUTURES SHOWED SOME STRENGTH AS NEW CROP CONCERNS WERE HIGHTENED AMID FORECAST FOR COOLER WEATHER NEXT WEEK IN U.S. WINTER WHEAT BELT. RAIN ACROSS U.S. NOW, HOWEVER, CON-TINUE TO FAVOR GROWING CONDI-TION AT THIS TIME. 
