MARY: Compared with last week: Feeder steers over 675 lbs. and heifers over 650 lbs. \$.50-\$.1.50 higher. Demand good for feeder cattle. Lighter weight stocker cattle \$.3.00-.4.00 higher. Demand excellent for stockers. Consist of supply changed considerable with a sharp increase in stocker cattle. Strong percentage of steers under 675 lbs. and heifers under 625 lbs. purchased for grazing. Feeders still coming off wheat but peak of run marketed over the past two weeks and this considered two weeks early for the trade area. Feeder cattle sold in average to full weigh condition and most still on fleshy side. Slaughter cows \$1.50-\$2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady to \$1.00 lower. Receipts this week 15,150; last week 20,922; last year 15,686. Supply includes 74 percent yearlings; 23 percent calves and stockers under 600 lbs.; 3 percent cows and bulls.
