Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained light to moderate but sufficient to keep the bulk of offerings clearing; however, discounting was noted on some heavy sizes. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged to 1 cent lower at 45 to 57 cents. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed in a full range. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, breast items remained in close balance and were no more than adequate overall. Leg quarters were in tighter supply and other parts were at least adequate.

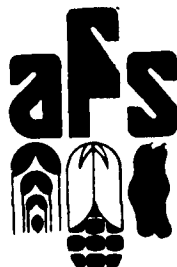
