Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair and about normal for midweek activity. Supplies were fully adequate with lighter weight sizes in close balance at most plants. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 46 to 58 cents. Slaughter schedules were reduced and of moderate volume as some operations were curtailed. Additional down time was scheduled for later in the week and next week. Live supplies were moderate and weights were generally desirable to heavy. Trade sentiment was about steady. Whole breasts and wings were in a stronger position while boneless skinless breasts were steady at best.


