Leg quarters were fully adequate to ample with asking prices trending lower. Yellow skin wings were short of meeting a very good demand and trading was at higher prices; white skin wings were in close balance to tight.

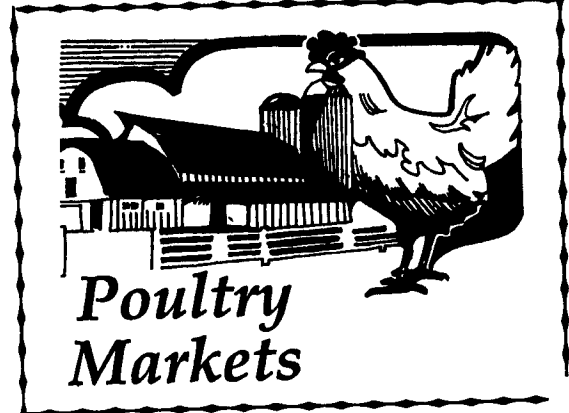

INTER-DEALER INQUIRY FOR EXTRA CARTONED AND LOOSE EGGS WAS ACTIVE, AND OFFERINGS REMAINED VERY LIMITED. SUPPLIES WERE SHORT TO ADEQUATE, AND THE FEW EXTRA EGGS THAT WERE OFFERED GENERALLY BROUGHT PREMIUM PRICES. A EXTRA LARGE .63-.68, A LARGE .61-.66, A MEDIUM .49-.52.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to very light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample and extra product remained slow in clearing. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 46 to 58 cents, but some product was negotiable at less than normal practices in an effort to clear stocks. Live supplies were moderate to light. Weights were desirable to heavy. Slaughter schedules reflected some reduction in operations today which were moderately heavy overall. Trade sentiment was no better than steady; improved for next week. Wings remained in tight supply for a good demand. Other parts were about steady.
