AROUND THE WORLD

n April 22, 1884, Thomas Stevens embarked from San Francisco on his bicycle trip around the world. He spent the spring and summer pedaling across America and arrived in Boston 125 days later, on August 24th. (The cur-

rent US transcontinental record from west to east coast is 8 days, 9 hours, 47 minutes set by Pete Penseyres in July 1986 Of course, Pete's modern bike was quite different from the 50-inch front wheel model used by Mr Stevens) From there he took a boat to Europe and continued his journey, actually pedaling about 13,500 miles by December 17, 1886, when

he arrived in Yokohama, Japan Boarding the City of Peking in Yokahama, he continued on to San Francisco, completing his trip on January 4, 1887

Well begun is half done.




