USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY KANSAS CITY HARD WHEAT AND DARK NORTHERN SPRING IN MINNEAPOLIS FINISHED LOWER BUT PORTLAND WHITE WHEAT AND ST. LOUIS SOFT RED CLOSED HIGHER, WEDNESDAY. CORN AND BEAN PRICES SHARPLY

LOWER IN FAST TRADING ON THE BOARD. WHEAT MIXED. CORN 4 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 6 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 6 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES MIXED WITH SOME SUPPORT STEMING FROM GOOD EXPORT SALES TO JAPAN. PRICES, HOWEVER, WERE UNDERMINED SOMEWHAT BY FAVORABLE GROWING WEATHER AND NO REPORTS RECENT SNOW STORM DAMAGED WHEAT. PLACES IN KANSAS MUCH IN NEED OF MOISTURE. CORN PRICES COLLAPSED, LOSING ALL OF TUESDAY'S GAINS DUE TO MAJOR FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD, SLOWDOWN OF IMMEDIATE EXPORT BUSINESS AND GOOD PLANTING WEATHER IN U.S. CORN BELT AREAS. SOYBEAN PRICES FELL SHARPLY LATE IN THE DAY FOLLOWING DECLINE IN CORN PRICES AND ABSENCE OF ANY NEW EXPORT SALES. BRAZIL HARVEST IN FULL SWING, A FACTOR IN THE MARKET.
