Because the Zimmerman children attend or have graduated from Kraybill Mennonite School, the family enjoys helping to make the annual benefit auction a success.


The 15th annual auction will be held Friday and Saturday, May 8 and 9, at 598 Kraybill Church Road, Mount Joy.

Things change so gradually that we hardly recognize the differences unless we seriously think about them.

When I got married we moved into an old house without plumbing and only recently installed electricity. So I washed dishes in a dishpan on the table and used water heated on a coal stove. It was carried in a bucket from the well in the lower corner of the yard. Now even the hand pump is gone and the well is sealed for sanitary purposes.

The wash machine was kept in the summerhouse and the oil in the moter thickened in cold weather and it could not be started. And, this was during the time that I had loads of cloth diapers to wash.

We had numerous people knock on the door. They brought bread several times a week and we had peddlars display their wares. A man from York County came regularly to buy our rags and another fellow ask to sharpen our knives and scissors. My mother told of the weekly visit of the ice man and the fish man. She said that they ate oyster soup every Saturday night. Even the men who buy junk seldom come to the farm anymore.

Gradually, we acquired modern appliances and our work was
