Demand good with active trading following C.O.F. report. This in spite of lackluster CME trading. Quality of supply average to attractive. Weigh-ups returned to the average to full condition which was much less attractive to buyers than last week. Flesh condition was highly varied with fair supply of thin yearlings available, but bulk consignments in average to fleshy wheat condition. Majority of supply 600-950 lb. steers and 550-850 lb. heifers. Slaughter cows \$1.00 higher. Slaughter bulls steady. Slaughter cattle demand good. 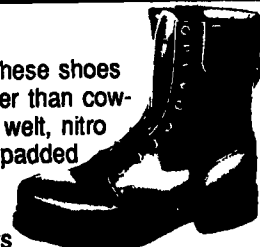
