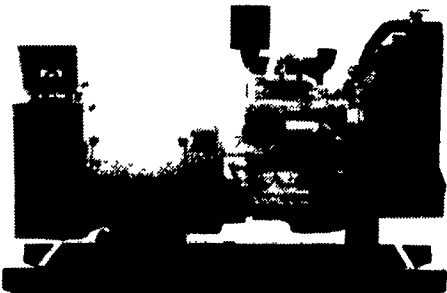
Throughout the career day event, faculty members will be present to provide curriculum-specific information as well as tours of laboratory facilities.
