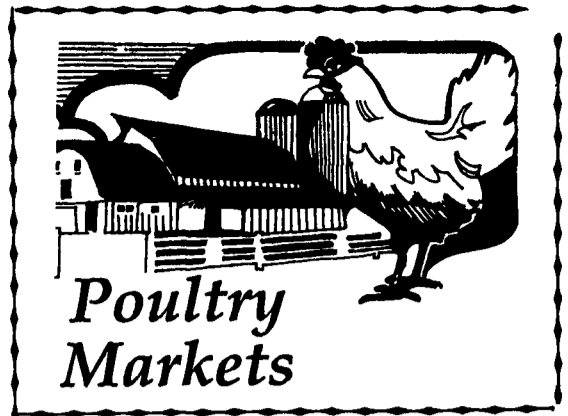

fully adequate; however, 2.5 and 3 pound
sizes were in limited supply. Less than
trucklot asking prices were unchanged to 1
cent higher at 46 to 59 cents. Slaughter
schedules were heavy with all plants run-
ning. Live supplies were moderate. The
undertone was steady to firm. Buyers inter-
est was good for boneless skinless breasts
and particularly leg quarters for late week
needs. Other items were at least adequate;
demand spotty.

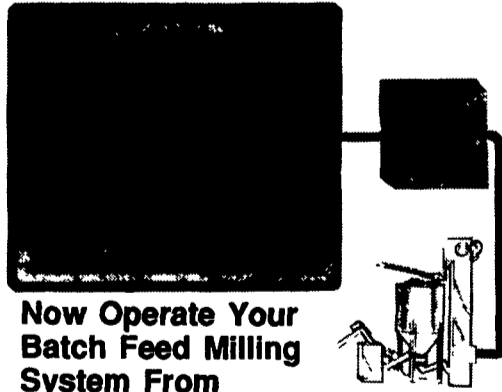
