GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED LOWER WEDNESDAY ON RUSSIAN EXPORT CREDIT CONCERNS AND CROP CONDITIONS. WHEAT 2 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. CORN STEADY TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 3 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES FELL SHARPLY ON DELAYS IN ALLOCATING RUSSIAN U.S. EXPORT CREDITS. HEAVY FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD DUE TO BEARISH WINTER WHEAT CROP PRODUCTION PROSPECTS, ALSO PRESSURED PRICES. RECENT TOUR REPORTS INDICATE IMPROVED CONDITION IN KANSAS HARD RED WINTER WHEAT AREAS. CORN AND BEAN PRICES DECLINED ON SPILLOVER WEAKNESS IN WHEAT PRICES. RUSSIAN EXPORT CREDIT DELAYS A FACTOR IN LOWER PRICES. RUSSIA HAS NOT YET

DETAILED COMMODITIES NEEDED BUT IDEAS MOST CREDITS WILL BE SOUGHT FOR WHEAT, WEAKENED CORN AND BEAN PRICES. CORN PRICES WERE ALSO UNDERMINED BY LACK OF NEW EXPORT DEMAND.

EXPORT NEWS: TAIWAN BOUGHT 54,000 TONNES U.S. NO. 2 YELLOW SOYBEANS FOR AUGUST. JAPAN'S CRUSHERS BOUGHT ABOUT 30,000 TO 40,000 TONNES U.S. SOYBEANS FOR JUNE SHIPMENT.
