#### FRESH BREEZE

ay 7 is the birthday of Sir Francis Beaufort. For those who haven't heard of him, Sır Francis was the British Admiral who devised Beaufort's Scale of Wind Speeds in 1806, later adopted by the International Meteorological committee for use in weather telegraphy. Still later the U.S. Weather Service also adopted the scale with modifications.

Beaufort's scale can indicate the wind strength when no instruments are available using descriptive criteria and a scale of 0 (calm) to 12 (hurricane). For instance, a hurricane is "that which no canvas could withstand." Recent changes include the addition of miles per hour, so we now know a fresh breeze (5) is 19-24 mph but a light breeze (2) is only 4-7 mph. Good to know when you're flying a kite on a balmy spring day!

When doubling a vegetable recipe, only increase the liquids and herbs and spices by half.

OLD FASHIONED SODA CRACKERS

½ teespoon beking sods

1 teespoon salt % cup sour milk 1 cup butter

Sift dry ingredients to-gether. Cut in milk and butter, mixing well to form a stiff dough. (To sour fresh milk, add 1 scant tablespoon vinegar or lemon juice.) Roll and turn over repeatedly until the dough is very stiff. Roll

very thin, cut into squares, and prick with a fork. Bake at 400° F until edges are lightly browned. Makes bout 50-60 crackers.




