his first train ride, where the team traveled from Washington, D.C. to Philadelphia to New York City. The team was guests of B.F. Goodrich at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel. "Mr. Goodrich sent his limo to the train station to pick us up. It was the first time some of us country bumpkins had even been to a big city, much less be driven around in a limousine. We even went to a hotel where there were men called porters who carried your bags, and room maids who mysteriously pulled down your bed covers at night.

"One night, while in New York, we were guests, along with A.W. Tenney, who was the national FFA executive secretary, in Mr.

Goodrich's box to see the Broadway play, "Oklahoma". Two other people came to the box and sat down in front of us. All of us kept whispering back and forth among each other that we had seen those people before and were trying to figure out which movie stars they were. At intermission, the lights came on, focused on our box and the play director introduced those two people to the audience. They were the Duke and Duchess of Windsor. As soon as they were seated again, the Duchess turned around, looked at us and extended her hand. I'll never forget that night. And I'll never forget that the price of the box seat that night was \$18.46. We thought that the amount was ridiculously high."
