WHEAT PRICES CLOSED MIXED, WEDNESDAY; CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES JUMPED SLIGHTLY HIGHER ON IMPROVED EXPORT OUTLOOK AND PLANTING PROGRESS. WHEAT MIXED, FROM STEADY TO 3 CENTS LOWER TO UP 11 CENTS IN MINNEAPOLIS. CORN 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 4 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES UNEVENLY MIXED AS PRIVATE FORECASTERS REPORTED POSSIBILITY FOR RAIN IN WINTER WHEAT GROWING AREAS THIS WEEK. CONCERNS STILL EXIST, HOWEVER, AS DRY, HOT WEATHER IN SPRING WHEAT REGIONS CONTINUE. EXPORT BUSINESS VERY SLOW THIS WEEK AND

ANNOUNCEMENT DELAYS CONTINUE FOR RUSSIAN CREDIT ALLOCATIONS. IMPROVED EXPORT OUTLOOK FOR CORN, SUPPORTED PRICES DUE TO REPORTS SOUTH AFRICA EXPECTED TO BID ON 265,000 TONNES U.S. CORN TONIGHT. FARMERS TAKING ADVANTAGE OF DRY WEATHER IN MIDWEST AND CORN AND BEAN PLANTING PROGRESSING. NEWS INDICATED UKRAINE TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL 110 MILLION TONNES IN FARM CREDITS, ALSO ADDED STRENGTH TO CORN AND BEAN PRICES.

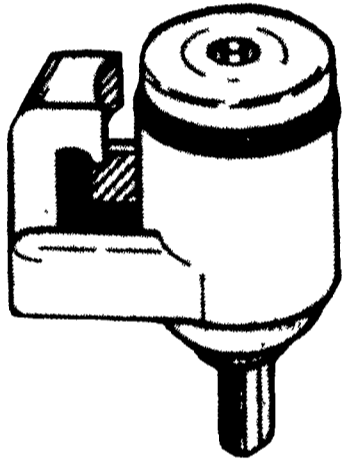
