

Penn State Offers Conservation Leadership Schools

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — This summer, 130 Pennsylvania teen-agers will learn about geology 200 feet underground in a limestone cave, study forest management principles by conducting a forest inventory and gain experience in citizen action by participating in a simulated public hearing.

They will attend Penn State's Conservation Leadership Schools (CLS). Held at the 700-acre Stone Valley Recreation Area in Huntingdon County, these two-week-long outdoor, residential workshops are open to 15- to 18-year-olds interested in exploring solutions to environmental issues. Students must have completed at

least one ninth-grade science class.

"This is no recreational summer camp," says Geroge Vahoviak, CLS co-director and an instructor in agricultural and extension education in Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences. "Our students have fun, but they come here to learn."

The curriculum includes basic ecology, land-use planning, environmental risk assessment, watershed and forest management and citizen action. "Much of the instruction takes place in the field," Vahoviak says. "Our students learn about natural resource management by conducting tests and using the results to develop

management plans."

Students work in groups of six to eight each, under the guidance of CLS instructors. The instructors have degrees and experience in forestry, wildlife management, biology, energy systems management, environmental interpretation and other disciplines. Instructors include representatives of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, the Pennsylvania Game Commission and Penn State faculty.

The \$265 tuition covers everything but transportation to and from the school. "We try to keep the program as inexpensive as possible so that it's accessible to all students," Vahoviak says. "Many students are sponsored by local organizations such as sporting clubs, conservation districts and environmental groups."

Living accommodations include four-person platform tents with cots, heated shower and restroom facilities, meals and all educational supplies.

Regular sessions will be held June 28 to July 11 and July 12 to 25. An advanced session, open only to students who previously attended a regular session, will be held July 30 to August 8.

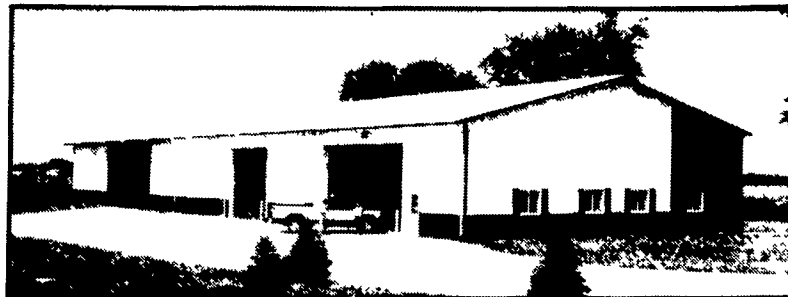
