Known to many as "The King of Tap Dancers," he was simply "Uncle Billy" to Shirley Temple, who worked with him in many movies. It was Uncle Billy who taught the child star the dances in *The Little Colonel*, their first film together, and the one which featured the memorable staircase dance. Shirley recalls that rehearsing over and over with a superlative and kindly teacher was exhilarating rather than drudgery. For those of you who remember excitedly watching the perfectly matched triple-time tap race up and down the stairs, here's some advice from Bojangles: "Limp wrists, loose in the shoulders. There, that's it! Copacetic! Now let's get your feet attached to your ears."

TIP OF THE WEEK

A little vinegar added to dishwasher will help cut the grease.

EARTHWISE

If the gardening bug has bitten you, try inviting more bugs into your garden. Ladybugs, the gardener's friend, attack aphids, leafworms, and leafhoppers. They're attracted by angelica, euonymus, goldenrod, morning glory, and yarrow. Lacewings control aphids, and flock to oleander and plants in the carrot family. Trichogramma wasps (which do not sting people) attack two hundred pest species, including spruce budworm. They like Queen Anne's lace, goldenrod, oleander, and strawbernes.

TENDER FLAKY PASTRY

2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
3/4 cup lard
about 6 tablespoons ice water

Combine flour and salt. Cut in lard until crumbs are the size of peas. Add ice water a spoonful at a time until dough holds together. Form dough into 2 balls, one slightly larger and flatten to about 1" high. Wrap well and chill for at least 1 hour. Roll out on lightly floured board, using larger piece for bottom crust.

Makes 1 double crust for 8" or 9" pie.

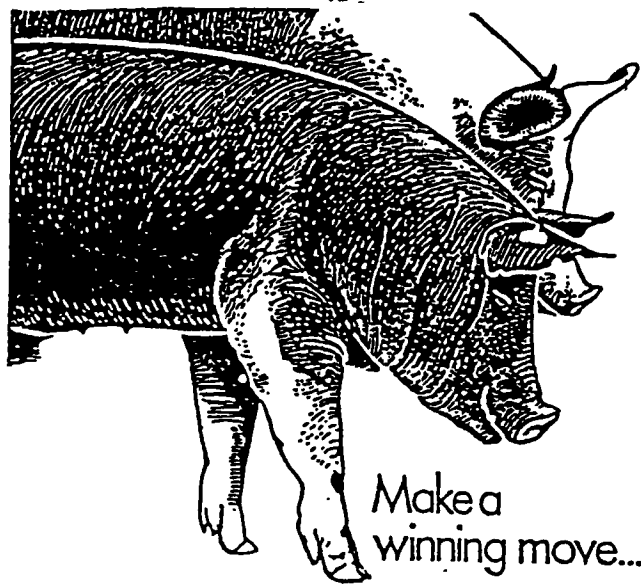
