Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow. Supplies were burdensome with over 3 pound sizes readily available for an unaggressive buyer. Less than trucklot asking prices were generally lower in a range

of 50 to 69 cents. The undertone continued weak and unsettled. Live supplies were moderate. Weights were usually heavier than desired. Slaughter schedules were heavy and some operations were planned for the upcoming Saturday. In the parts complex, breast items were not as freely available but still ample overall. Leg items continued to clear better, except thighs were still slow.

Trading was reported in the 1.95-2.00 price range but the bulk of new trades were at the 1.95 level. Line run breasts were readily available and new trades were at lower prices. The undertone showed a slight improvement for late week production. Leg quarters continued to be forced to clear at 20 cents. Drumsticks were in good balance while thighs were fully adequate. Wings were under pressure to hold at current prices.

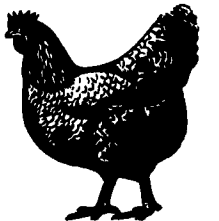
