OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY

Compared with last week: Feeder cattle and calves \$2.00-\$3.00 higher. Demand very good for all classes. Trade active thru-out the two day session. Quality of supply average thru attractive. Weigh condition uneven, gaunt to full; overall less attractive to buyers than past two stormy weeks. Flesh condition remains attractive with most feeder cattle and much of calf and stocker supply in average to moderately thin condition. Fleishy cattle also selling at the posted advance. Pastures are well soaked with 30% chance of rain forecasted every day. Wheat harvesters still standing by for open weather. Slaughter cows and bulls rebounded from early declines to close steady. Receipts this week 8,200; last week 7,533; last year 15,073. Supply consisted of 84% yearlings over 600 lbs.; 10% calves; 6% cows and bulls. 
