SHADOWS AND ECLIPSES

n the night of June 14-15, there will be a partial eclipse of the Full Strawberry Moon, that is, the Moon will pass through the Earth's complete shadow (umbra) so that a portion of the Moon is darkened by that shadow Do not confuse a partial eclipse with a penumbral eclipse. In a penumbral eclipse, the Moon does not pass through the umbra where com-

plete darkness prevails, but only passes through the



area of partial shadow known as the penumbra. During this week's partial eclipse, the Moon passes through the penumbra (beginning at 9.09 PM FST) on its way to entering umbra (at 10.26 P.M. FST). The Moon leaves umbra at 1.27 V.M., FST and leaves penumbra at 2.45 x M , EST

LOGANBERRY PIF

3 cups loganberries

1 cup sugar

1 cup heavy cream 1 double-crust pie pastry

ine a 10-inch pie plate with pastry and fill with berries Cover with pastry and pierce to let steam escape Bake at 425° F for 10 minutes, then at 350° F for 40 minutes Take pie from oven and carefully cut and remove top crust off pie Sprinkle sugar over berries and replace top crust At serving time, again lift off top crust and pour cream over berries Replace crust and serve

Makes one 10' pie.




