DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES MOSTLY HIGHER ON HARVEST DELAYS; CORN AND BEAN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER ON RAINY MIDWEST WEATHER. WHEAT MIXED, FROM 2 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER TO 6 CENTS LOWER IN MINNEAPOLIS. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENT LOWER. SORG-HUM STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CONTINUED RAINY WEATHER IN MIDWEST AREAS LIMITED WHEAT HARVEST ACTIVITY, ESPECIALLY IN SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT AREAS. CONCERNS OVER QUALITY OF YIELDS, ADDED TO STRENGTH IN WHEAT PRICES. GOOD EXPORT DEMAND FOR WHEAT THIS WEEK. MINNEAPOLIS TRUCK WHEAT POSTED LOWER PRICES AS HARVEST JUST AROUND THE COR-NER AND NEARBY NEEDS LIGHT. RAIN AND MILD TEMPERATURES IN MIDWEST REGIONS RELIEVED DRY WEATHER STRESS IN CORN AND BEAN CROPS, PUSHING PRICES LOWER. WEATHER OUTLOOK CALL-ING FOR ABOVE-NORMAL RAIN AND MILD TEMPERATURES. SOY-BEAN PRICES ALSO PRESSURED BY TURNAROUND IN SOYMEAL TRADE.


