In his opinion, some literature was too impious and indecent to be read in front of children, so he "purified" the works of Shakespeare, Edward Gibbon's History of the Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire, and even portions of the Old Testament, removing "those words and expressions which cannot with propri-ety be read aloud in a family " When his methods were criticized he countered that any words which gave "an impression of obscenity" should not be spoken or printed, and if printed they "ought to be erased" His censorship was so offensive that 'bowdlerize" became a term of contempt, synonymous with self-righteous expurgation
