in progress. Supplies were usually suffi-  
cient although in some areas product was  
being held with a bit more confidence.  
Breaker demand was mixed as additional  
offerings were held for higher values.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds  
was light to fair and about normal for mid-  
week activity. Supplies and offerings were  
adequate to ample and in heaviest balance  
on under 3 pound sizes. Less than trucklot  
asking prices were unchanged at 55 to 62  
cents but some lighter weight birds were  
slow to clear at discounted price levels.  
Live supplies were moderate. Weights  
were light to desirable and cooler weather  
in local production centers was expected to  
shortly increase overall sizes. Slaughter  
schedules were heavy. Trade sentiment  
was steady at best. All forms of breasts  
were strong; leg items were barely steady  
to weak.

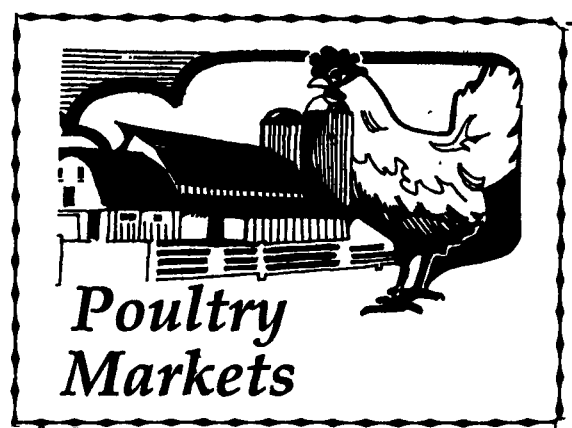
