GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER, WEDNESDAY, ON IMPROVED OUTLOOK FOR SPRING WHEAT CROP AND FAVORABLE GROWING CONDITIONS FOR

CORN AND BEANS. WHEAT 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT MINNEAPOLIS 2 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES DECLINED DESPITE GOOD EXPORT DEMAND. COMBINES BUSY IN FIELDS BETWEEN SHOWERS. PROSPECTS GOOD FOR BUMPER U.S. SPRING WHEAT CROP AS RECORD BREAKING RAINFALL FOR JULY IMPROVED CROP OUTLOOK BUT DELAYED WINTER WHEAT HARVEST DETERIORATING BOTH QUALITY AND QUANTITY. SHADOW CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER ON CONTINUED GOOD GROWING WEATHER AND SLOWDOWN IN EXPORT ACTIVITY.

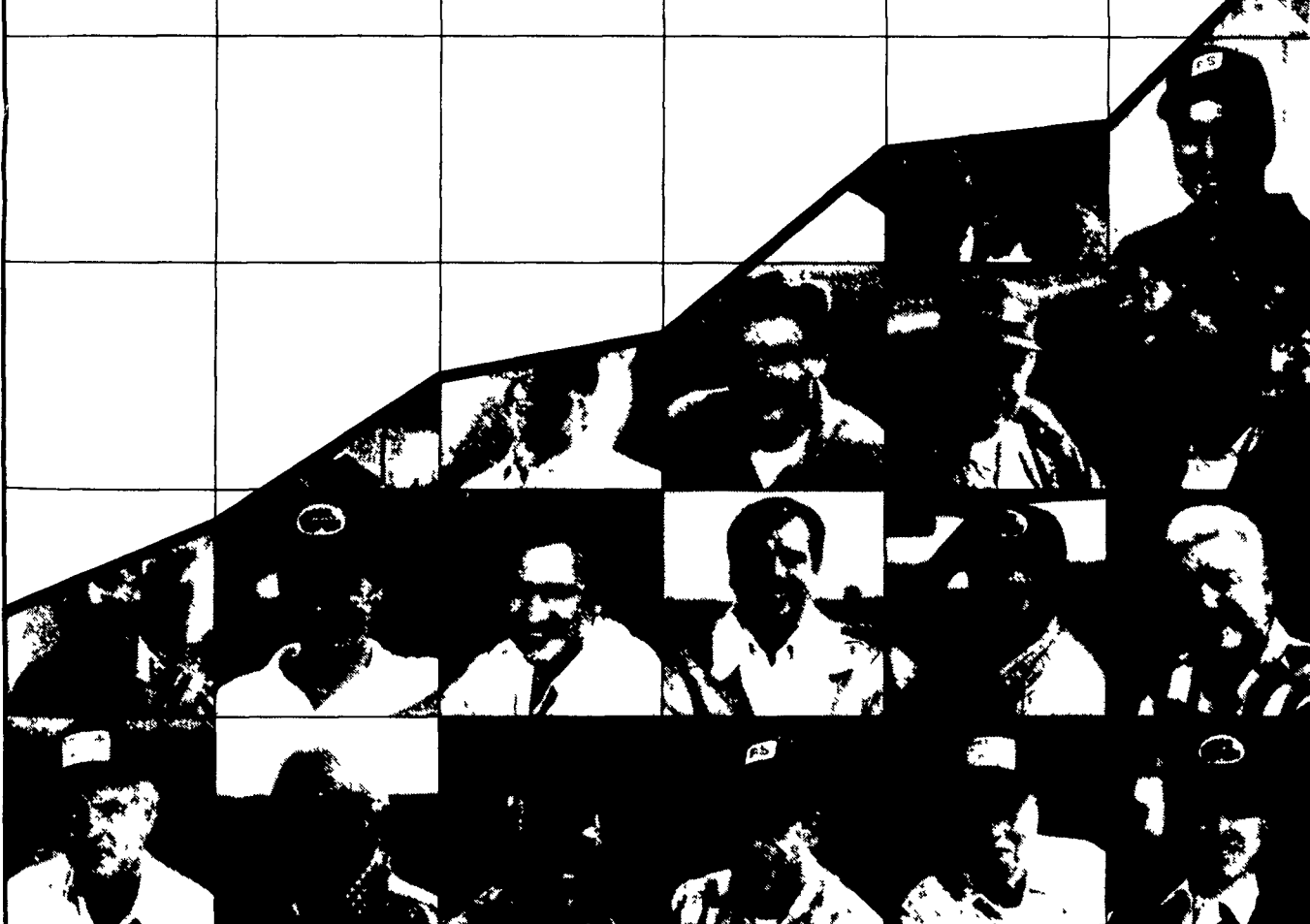
