Trucklot buying interest ranged light to very good. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were at least adequate for current needs; some product still moved at 2.20 but most new trades were booked at 2.15. Retail demand was slow and disappointing, food service demand was fairly good. Line run breast supplies were tight but most buyer needs were covered at steady prices. Legs, thighs, and drumsticks cleared to a fairly good demand. Leg quarters were short of an active demand and prices trended higher.

Wings were available at current prices but buying interest improved.

Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 63 cents. Live supplies were moderate. Weights varied from light to heavy, but were mostly light to desirable. Slaughter schedules were heavy. 
