

4-H Dairy Goat Roundup Largest In Years

KIMBERTON (Chester Co.) — The Chester County 4-H Dairy Goat Roundup was held at the

Kimberton Fairgrounds recently. A total of 50 project goats were shown, more than double last

year's show entries. In the past three years, the number of goats shown has averaged about 20. This year, because of the large number of entries, the show was divided into two classes — Alpines and all other breeds.

Joan Stump, an Alpine breeder and showperson from Telford, instructed the 4-H'ers in how to improve their showing and fitting techniques. In the Alpine Class with 23 entries, she made Christine Anderson, Landenberg, senior and grand champion with her beautiful 3- to 5-year-old doe, Mai-Tai. Jami Hanna, Nottingham, showed a 2-year-old doe, Ebony, that was strong competition for the champion and was named reserve senior and reserve grand champion. Junior champion honors were swept by Laura Anderson, Landenberg. Her yearling kid, Cossette, was junior champion and Carsela, a kid under 4 months, captured the reserve junior champion ribbon.

In the other breeds combined class, the following breeds were exhibited: 15 Toggenburgs, five Oberhasli, four LaMancha, two Nubian, and one Sonnen. Senior

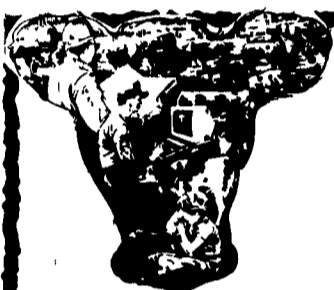

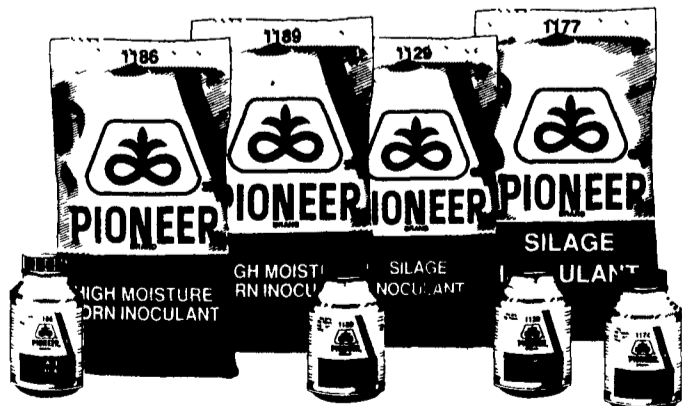
