

## **Horse Show Dates** 7 Set For NAILE

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Class offerings and dates for the 1992 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) Quarter Horse Show are now confirmed.

This year three AQHA events have been added to the already impressive offering: amateur calf roping, amateur steer roping (heading), and amateur steer roping (heeling). The dates for this year's Quarter Horse Show are November 6-12.

Another change is the modification of existing classes. AQHA youth mares and geldings classes will be split. The North American Calf Roping Classic has a new fee and payback schedule and dally team roping, 40 years and over, will include a finals round for the top 10 competitors.

The 1992 schedule will be similar to that of 1991. The major change in this area involves movement of some classes previously

held on Monday to Sunday in order to accommodate an earlier start for the NAILE team penning on Monday afternoon. Last year's team penning event spanned near. ly 12 hours. This year it will start at noon on Monday, November 9 Premiums in 1991 were nearly \$12,000. They are expected to be even larger this year.

All National Cutting Horse Association classes will be held on Friday, November 6. Youth events are scheduled for the weekend November 7 and 8, to better ac. commodate youngsters' school schedules.

Premiums for the entire Quarter Horse Show now exceed \$50,000 and the show consistently ranks in the top five of those held in the United States. 
