management, nutrient management, barnyard management, stream fencing, and farmstead assessment.

Recently, highlights of the lessons learned in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Clean Water Program were discussed at a conference last week.

The program, held at Lancaster's Farm and Home Center, 1383 Arcadia road, explained the findings of the project.

During the 10-year Rural Clean Water Program (RCWP) project, the effects of using agricultural best management practices (BMPs) to control nonpoint source

pollution were studied. The practices studied included nutrient management and pipe outlet terraces.

The results of extensive ground and surface water monitoring done in conjunction with implementing these practices were reported by staff of the United States Geological Survey, who did the monitoring.

At last week's program, Penn State extension staff discussed nutrient management principles and educational strategies used to implement nutrient management in the upper Conestoga watershed.

Putting agricultural nonprofit source pollution in perspective and control of agricultural nonpoint source pollution were discussed by Soil Conservation Service personnel. A farmer's perspective was

provided by Aaron Stauffer, owner of one of the farms where groundwater monitoring was conducted. For more information about

Council Helps Ukraine **Obtain Credit**

WASHINGTON, D.C. - In May, USDA announced a firstever GSM-102 credit guarantee line of \$110 million for Ukraine thanks in large measure to efforts of the U.S. Feed Grains Council.

In January, Ukraine grain trade, government and banking officials revealed to the Council their readiness for Ukraine's own line of GSM-102 to the former Soviet Union and Russia.

The Council advised Ukraine officials to submit an official request for the credit guarantees and proof of their credit worthiness to USDA. The Council also sent a letter to the administration requesting USDA grant \$300 million in GSM-102 to Ukraine.

Of the \$110 million in credit guarantees granted, \$33.7 million was allocated to feed grains.






