USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY NO GOOD NEWS FOR GRAIN AND SOYBEAN MARKETS BUT WHEAT PRICES HIGHER. WHEAT 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 4 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. HOT WEATHER AND FORECAST OF NEAR OR ABOVE NORMAL TEMPERATURES FOR NEXT FEW DAYS EXPECTED TO INCREASE CROP MATURITY RATE AND MELT TALKS OF EARLY FROST. COUNTRY MOVEMENT OF CORN AND SOYBEANS AS TIME OF YEAR FOR FARMERS AND COUNTRY ELEVATORS TO CLEAN OUT THEIR BINS AND GET READY FOR NEW CROPS. BUMPER CROP PREDICTIONS AND ALREADY CONCERNS ABOUT SHORTAGE OF STORAGE SPACE AND RAILROAD CARS. A FLUSH OF LARGE EXPORT ORDERS STILL NOT ON THE BOOKS; LIKE RUSSIA, CHINA, EGYPT ETC.. CANADIAN WHEAT BOARD SUSPEDED ALL GRAIN SHIPMENTS TO RUSSIA DUE TO FINANCIAL PROBLEMS. FREE TRADE AGREEMENT EXPECTED TO INCREASE U.S. EXPORT OF CORN, BEANS AND SOYBEAN MEAL TO MEXICO. COUNTRY ELEVATORS, ESPECIALLY IN OUTLYING AREAS THAT HAVE LOST RAIL SERVICE ARE BIDDING NEW CROP CORN BELOW 2.00 AND SOYBEANS AROUND 5.00. TIME TO START LOOKING AT SUPPORT

PRICES AND SET ASIDE ACERAGE FOR 1993.

EXPORT NEWS: JAPAN BOUGHT 114,282 TONNES OF WHEAT WITH 57,141 TONNES FROM THE U.S. FOR ITS OCTOBER REQUIREMENTS. TAIWAN PURCHASED ABOUT 78,700 TONNES OF U.S. WESTERN WHITE WHEAT FOR SHIPMENT JAN/OCT. THE COMMODITY CREDIT CORP. PURCHASED 14,500 TONNES OF NO. 2 OR BETTER U.S. NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT IN A DONATION TENDER FOR THE PHILIPPINES, SHIPMENT FROM THE GULF SEP/OCT. SAUDI ARABIA BOUGHT 10,000 TONNES OF U.S. SOYMEAL FOR LAST HALF SEP.- FIRST HALF OCT SHIPMENT. U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED A BID TO COVER THE SALE OF 1,400 TONNES OF SUNOIL TO MEXICO UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, SHIPMENT IS SCHEDULED FOR DECEMBER.

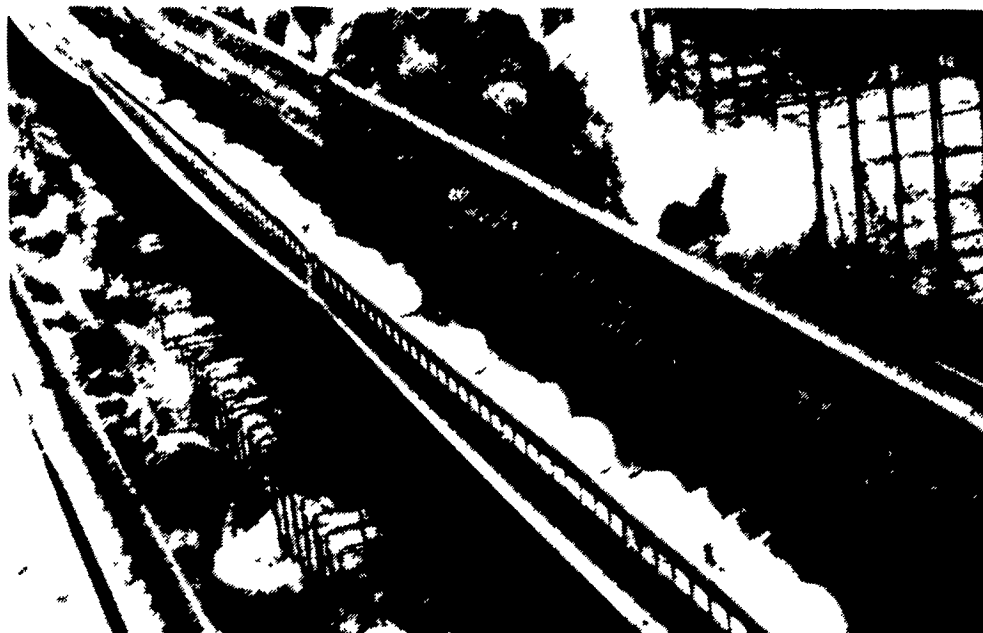
