**A DAY TO REMEMBER AN APOSTLE**

Bartholomew was one of the 12 apostles and is believed to have been flayed alive in Armenia in A D 44 for his faith. His feast day is the infamous anniversary of the massacre in Paris and throughout France of thousands of Huguenots (Protestants) The Massacre began when the church bells tolled early in the morning on St. Bartholomew's Day, August 24, 1572 King Charles IX ordered the killings with the approval of his mother, Catherine de Médicis. Up to 70,000 were eventually put to death. This was also the day of the famous Bartholomew Fayre, held in Smithfield near London for over 700 years, until 1855. The fair became famous both for the merchandise it offered and for riotous drinking.

Recycling plastic is not easy. There are many types of plastic, so you need to contact your local recycling center to find out what can be recycled. Plastic in soft drink bottles (PET) is the most recycled plastic. It's used mostly for fiberfill that goes into sleeping bags and jackets. The HDPE plastic that you find in milk jugs and detergent bottles is harder to recycle, so is LDPE, which is used in plastic bags and shrink wrap. Some supermarkets do have bins for used grocery and produce bags, so don't throw them away.

**OLD-FASHIONED APPLE DESSERT**

- 3 cups sliced apples
- 1-1/2 cups soft bread crumbs
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 3/4 cup water

Mix apples, bread crumbs, brown sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg together in a bowl. Turn into a buttered 1 1/2 to 2-quart baking dish. Pour melted butter and water over the top. Bake at 350° F for 45 minutes or until apples are soft. Serve with ice cream or cream.

Serves 4-6 people.

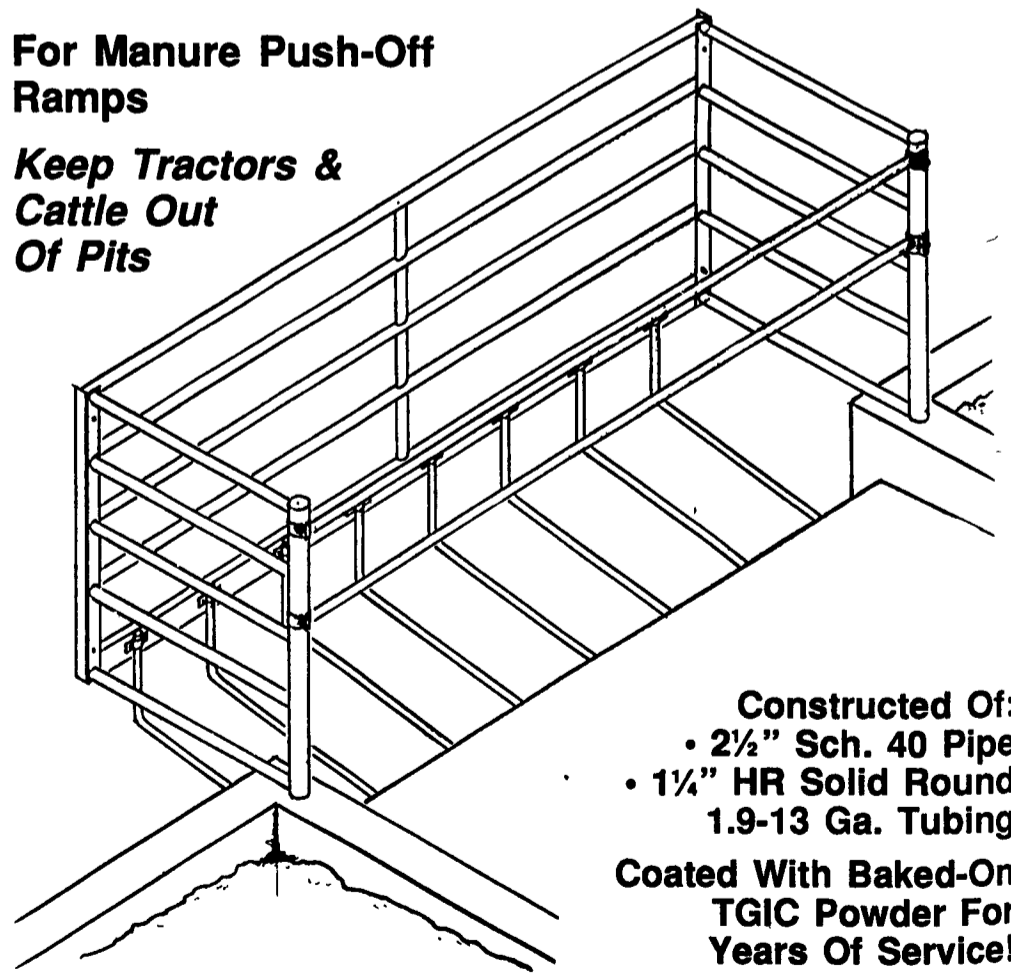

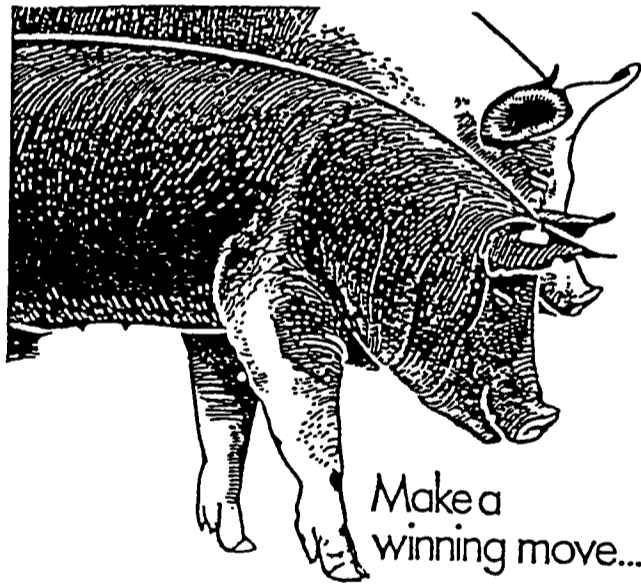
