
Cultivator Sizes For Lower H.P. Tractors

GOODFIELD, III. - DMI, Inc., manufacturer of conservation yield-till tools, recently introduced seven new sizes for their DMI Tiger-Mate field cultivators to fit lower horsepower tractors.

These new smaller-sizes come in the following working widths: 11-1/2 feet, 12-1/2 feet, 13-1/2 feet, and 14-1/2 feet nonfold models, and 16-1/2 feet, 17-1/2 feet, and 18-1/2 feet singlefold models.

According to Larry VanEtten, DMI product manager, "These Tiger-Mates, like their big brothers, are the most effective residue-handling field cultivators for the '90's.'

DMI Tiger-Mates have unequaled features and benefits that easily handle all residue created by any conservation tillage practice, according to Van Etten. These features and benefits include true 6 inch shank spacing (none closer than 24 inch) that provides uniform tillage, best chemical incorporation, and a level finish job; A 5-bar frame with 30-inch rank spacings for nonstop residue flow-through; more stability and even tracking

with split-the-middle-sweeps (SMS) where the first three rows of sweeps take a full cut while the fourth and fifth rows take out the middles; spring mounting assemblies with 120-pound trip force and 14-inch trip height (pressure decreases as trip height increases); and a self-leveling hitch for uniform operation fore and aft.

Optional equipment includes a 3-bar coil tine harrow that fits all

sizes or a 5-bar spike tooth harrow for the 11-1/2 to 14-1/2 sizes only.

"In addition to their size and feature benefits," said VanEtten, "these new Tiger-Mates are priced right, along with the larger models that have been price-reduced up to five percent for the 1992-1993 season."
