

## **Companies Collaborate** On Seed Coating

DALLAS, Texas — Gustafson, Inc. has announced a cooperative effort with Landec Corporation, Menlo Park, Calif., to evaluate and exchange data related to a potential breakthrough seed coating.

The coating, which delays germination of planted seed until a preset soil temperature has been reached, utilizes a new class of temperature-activated polymers invented by Landec, called Intelimers. Landec was recently awarded a Phase II Small Business Innovation Research grant by the USDA for further research into Intelimers.

The coating would allow growers to plant in much cooler soils than is currently practical. Intelimers form a barrier that prevents the seed from imbibing water, which begins the germination process, until a preset soil temperature has been reached.

When the proper soil temperature is reached, the Intelimer coating breaks down, allowing the seed to take in water and begin germination. The preselected temperature can be set to meet the ideal soil temperature for any given crop, for optimum germination and plant uniformity.

Under today's farming practices, growers try to plant as early as possible, which normally increases a crop's yield potential.

Early planting, however, has its

"chilling" injury, which occurs when the seed germinates and imbibes water in cool soil. When this occurs, the seed can be damaged, and sometimes killed, resulting in lower crop yields and, if replanting is required, higher production costs. "Intelimers can help prevent

drawbacks. It often results in

these problems associated with early planting by activating on a preset soil temperature," said Gustafson President W.J. Donwen.

Donwen said the cooperation between Gustafson and Landec could have a major impact on agriculture worldwide.

"Intelimers hold the potential to give growers flexibility in planting dates. If Intelimers are proven successful, earlier planting dates should improve yield potential and reduce replanting expenses. The benefit to the grower will be increased production, higher crop quality, and less risk in additional crop costs," Donwen said.


