NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices trended higher for mediums in the Northeast, otherwise prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment was about steady with some caution showing on the larger sizes. Movement of cartoned eggs ranged light to instances very good with the best call where features were in progress. Supplies of extra large were fully adequate to ample and offered; large were at least adequate; and mediums ranged adequate to tight. Breakers took a wait and see approach. Trading and demand was light and nest run prices were unchanged. Demand for light type hens was light. Some flocks previously booked were rescheduled for later pick-up.

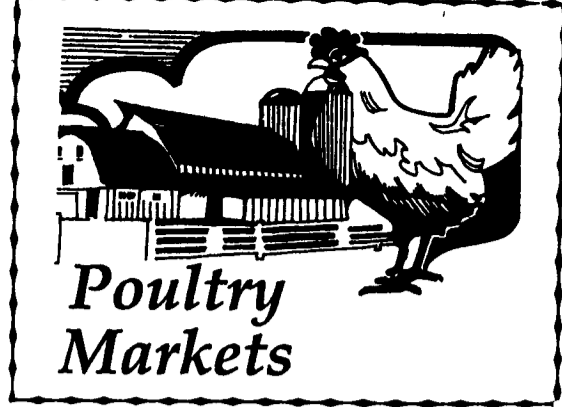
Wednesday, September 9, 1992

The New Jersey inventory was 15% below last Monday's level, and the New York inventory was 21% below last week.

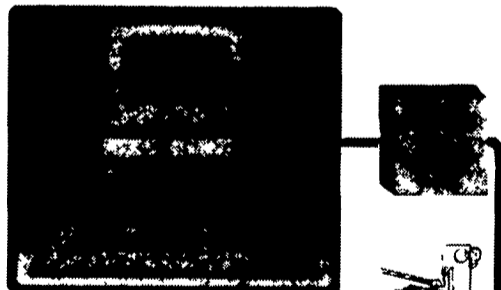
