YORK (York Co.)—Shawn Waltimyer, Airville, had a repeat performance when he led his crossbred steer to the winner's circle in the open show at the York Fair. Waltimyer had won the show last year, also with a crossbred steer. In addition to the supreme championship, the 15-year-old son of Harley and Carol Waltimyer showed the Simmental breed champion. Earlier at the fair he won the 4-H Market steer show. Shawn has been showing steers in 4-H for eight years.

The reserve champion of the show followed the grand champion from the Other Breeds division for Ben Stine, East Berlin. Stine was playing football, so his winning steer was shown by Jamie Boyer.

Reserve breed champion Simmental was shown by Jarrod Schiding, Dallastown. K & K Cattle Co. Fleetwood, showed the Chianina champion.

In the Hereford breed, Jennifer Altobelli, Dover, showed the champion, and Jason Frantz, Seven Valleys, showed the reserve

Temmi Grubb, Hanover, showed the champion Angus and Kelly Myers, Thomasville, had the

reserve champion Angus.

In all, 44 steers were shown to Scott McIntire, cattle breeder from Whitepost, MD.

At ringside to present the plate from the Agricultural Association was Daniel Shive. Shive is 81 years-old and has attended about 35 shows at the York Fair.

"Over the years the cattle have changed," Shive said. "First they were low to the ground. Then they turned and grew them tall, maybe too tall. Now they have come back to a more moderate size," he said.

Waltimyer Repeats 4-H Steer Win Too

YORK (York Co.) — For the second consecutive year, the judge smacked the muscular rump of Shawn Waltumyer's entry to designate the Airville young man as champion winner in the York Fair's 4-H market steer show.

The 1175-pound, light heavyweight class winner is a Maine-Anjou crossbred and one of two weight division winners exhibited by the 15-year-old Airville beef exhibitor. Waltimyer also took the lightweight division with a second steer entry.

Tammi Grubb picked up her first reserve champion win with "Alex," her 1090-pound Angus entry which took mediumweight class honors. Tammi, 11, resides with her family near Hanover.

Heavyweight division honors went to Kim Frantz, with Matt Sellers in the reserve division

spot. Other division reserve winners were Keith Grubb, lightweight, Jason Rankin, mediumweight, Brett Bishard and light heavyweight. Best bred and owned steer award went to Jodi Dutrey and Shawn Waltimyer earned the Cattlemen's Association's savings bond award for a winning steer purchased from a local breeder.

4-H Beef Breeding

Robin Shive, Seven Valleys, topped the Angus classes with her homebred heifer which also won the Fair's open class supreme title. Tammi Grubb, Hanover, was the reserve champion.

Simmental honors went to Seven Valleys 4-H'er Raymond Stough, taking both champion and reserve rosettes. Jodi Dutrey, Dallastown, and Jarod Schiding, Dallastown, finished in the champion and reserve places in the category for other breeds. Shawn Waltimyer was the lone Chianina

exhibitor.

Jason Rankin, Abbottstown, was named champion showman, with Kelly Dutrey, Dallastown, the reserve winner. Beef fitting awards went to Robin Shive, champion and Raymond Stough, reserve. Special fitting competition trophies were won by Robin Shive, senior division, Suzanne Bishard, intermediate, and Kelly Myers, rookie.
