USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY EXPORT OUTLOOK BRIGHT FOR WHEAT PRICES BUT CORN, SORGHUM AND SOYBEANS FADED. WHEAT 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER, SOFT WHEAT AS MUCH AS 7 TO 10 CENTS UP. CORN 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER, SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER AND SOYBEANS 2 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. RECENT LIBERAL EEP, GSM, CREDIT ALLOCATIONS AND DONATIONS A BRIGHT SPOT IN EXPORT BUSINESS BUT MORE BENEFICIAL TO WHEAT PRICES IN WEDNESDAY'S TRADE. WHEAT HARVEST STILL UNDERWAY IN NORTHERN STATES AND WINTER WHEAT SEEDING IN SOUTHERN AND CENTRAL STATES MAKING GOOD PROGRESS WITH PLENTIFUL MOISTURE. THE 1993 WHEAT PROGRAM CALLS FOR NO SETASIDE AND SUPPORT PRICE OF 4.00 PER BUSHEL. RUSSIA INTERESTED IN CORN AND BOUGHT SOYBEAN MEAL UNDER IT'S NEW GSM 102 CREDIT LINE. PRICES STILL LOWER WITH FROST AND HARVEST WORRIED ALSO ON MANY MINDS. MORE

AND MORE AREAS REPORTING COMBINES IN THE BEAN FIELDS AND CORN PICKING MOVING UP INTO SOUTHERN ILLINOIS, ALONG A LINE IN THE PROXIMITY OF THE 40 DEGREE NORTH LATITUDE.

EXPORT NEWS: MOROCCO BOUGHT 117,038 TONNES OF U.S. SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT USING PL480 FINANCING FOR OCT/NOV SHIPMENT. PAKISTAN BOUGHT ABOUT 59,760 TONNES OF U.S. WHEAT UNDER EEP AND USING GSM CREDIT FOR OCT SHIPMENT. THE U.S. WILL DONATE 100,000 TONNES OF WHEAT AND FLOUR TO THE FORMER SOVIET REPUBLIC OF GEORGIA AND ALSO PAY THE COST OF SHIPPING IT THERE. THE RUSSIAN REPUBLIC BOUGHT ABOUT 100,000 TONNES OF U.S. SOYMEAL IN GSM-102 CREDITS FOR SEP/OCT SHIPMENT.

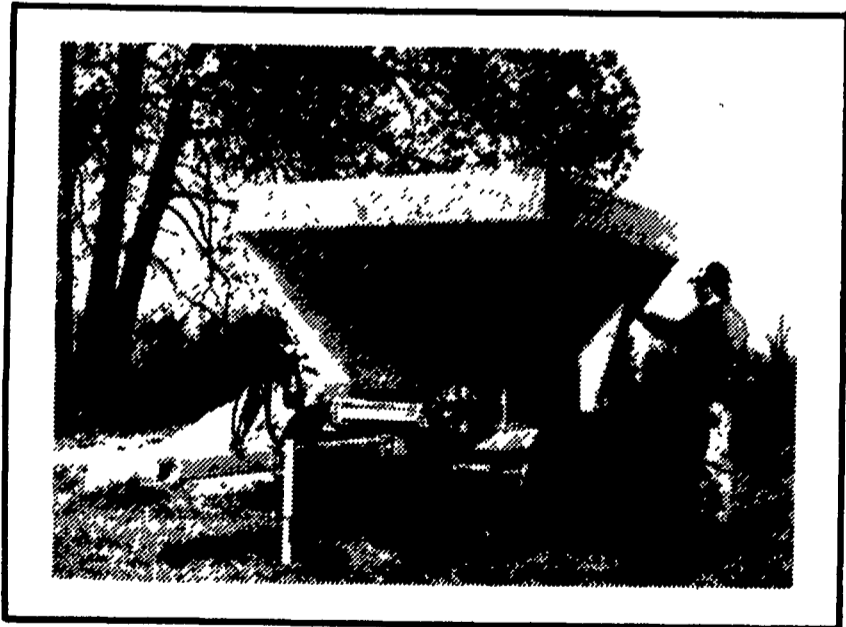
