Schedule Set For KILE

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Keystone International Livestock Exposition celebrated its 35th birthday last year with the largest show in 10 years. More than 4,400 head of beef cattle, swine, sheep and horses from throughout the United States and Canada were entered for competition.

The best livestock breeders and exhibitors in the country are expected to compete at the 36th exposition in Harrisburg, October 1-5. Parking and admission to the Farm Show Complex are free.

The proud traditions that make KILE a showcase for the nation's top livestock breeders will continue in 1992. The show management always tries to keep it competitive with other national livestock shows.

Junior events are a major component of the show. A special show for Pennsylvania's junior swine exhibitors, the production class for junior barrows, is on the

1992 schedule. Other competition for the younger set includes the junior and intercollegiate livestock judging contest, junior beef breeding, junior steers, junior barrows, and the Keystone Stockman's Contest.

The Duroc Keystone Classic Sale, five yearling bred ewe sales, and a feeder calf sale afford breeders an excellent opportunity to purchase quality livestock.

National breed organizations recognize the importance of KILE and frequently use the site for their regional show or as a qualifying event for a series.

KILE's Limousin Cattle Show has been designated by the North American Limousin Foundation as a "Medal of Excellence Show," making it one of eight approved regional shows to qualify participants for their national show.

Once again, the Draft Horse Show is a qualifying event in the North American Six-Horse Hitch
