NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower on the large sizes in the East, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was barely steady to weak on the large sizes, about steady to instances weak on the balance. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to ample on the large sizes, and mediums were adequate. Brown egg supplies were short to adequate. Breakers received adequate shell egg supplies. Live hen markets were steady.

Prices were lower on the large sizes, unchanged on mediums. Trade sentiment was about steady for mediums, and barely steady to weak for the large sizes. Demand was light to moderate. Supplies were at least adequate. The New Jersey inventory was 17% above last Monday's level, and the New York inventory was 10% above last week.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally about fair. Offerings of whole birds were irregular, but usually sufficient to cover current needs. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Live supplies were moderate. Weights were light to desirable, mostly desirable. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 51 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was unsettled. In the parts complex, white meat items were in the best position while dark meat items struggled.

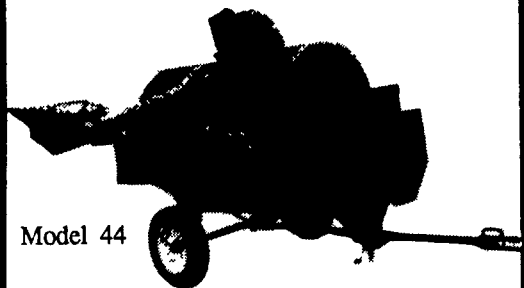

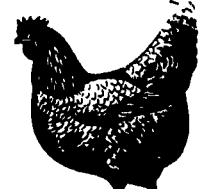
