USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY RUSSIAN EXPORT NEWS, HARVEST PRESSURE, AND WEATHER CONDITIONS SENT GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOWER, TUESDAY. WHEAT 2 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 4 CENTS LOW-

ER. NEWS OF RUSSIA'S LATEST WHEAT OFFER REJECTED AGAIN AND REPORTS THEIR CROP YEAR LOOKS PROMISING, PRESSURED WHEAT PRICES LOWER. U.S. SPRING WHEAT BELT ENJOYING GOOD HARVEST PROGRESS WITH DRY WEATHER FORECAST FOR REMAINDER OF THIS WEEK. OTHER GOOD EXPORT INTERESTS SHOWING UP ON BOOKS FOR ALL GRAINS, LIMITED LOSSES. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES ALSO SLIPPED LOWER DUE TO REDUCED FROST FEARS AND

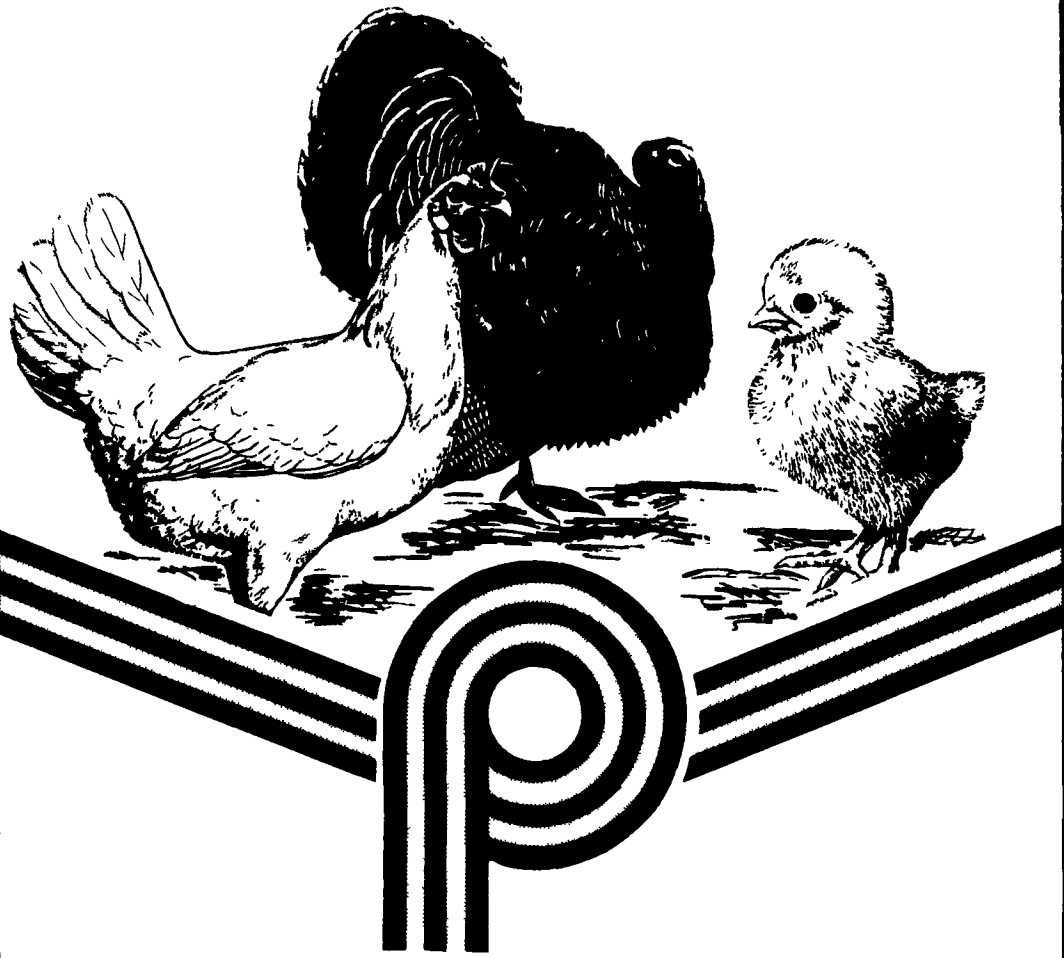
