WHEAT PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER ON CHINA CONCERNS, LARGER ANTICIPATED CROP YIELD ESTIMATE AND CONTINUED DELAYS IN RUSSIAN CREDIT ANNOUNCEMENT; CORN AND BEAN PRICES UNCHANGED TO SLIGHTLY HIGHER ON HARVEST DELAYS AND ACTIVE EXPORT DEMAND. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 7 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED LOWER AS REPORTS CHINA MAY HAVE BOUGHT 1.0 MILLION TONNES OF CANADIAN WHEAT RECENTLY. CHINA HAS BEEN ALLOCATED 7 MILLION TONNES OF U.S. SUBSIDIZED WHEAT BUT REMAIN ABSENT FROM U.S. EXPORT MARKET NEARLY A YEAR. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND TODAY FOR U.S. WHEAT. USDA HAS NOT YET RELEASED COMMODITY BREAKDOWN OF RUSSIA'S EXPORT CREDIT GUARANTEES. CORN AND BEAN PRICES UNCHANGED TO SLIGHTLY HIGHER AS WEEKEND RAINS DELAYED HARVEST IN MANY AREAS. REPORTED EXPORT SALES GOOD PAST COUPLE DAYS FOR CORN AND BEANS. PRICE GAINS WERE LIMITED ON POSITION EVENING BEFORE THURSDAY'S USDA CROP PRODUCTION REPORT.
