THE PRESIDENT'S HOUSE

The cornerstone was laid October 13, 1792 (200 years ago), for the President's House. James Hoban, an Irish-American, won the contest and the \$500 prize money for best design and beat Thomas Jefferson, who also had submitted a drawing. The pale gray limestone cornerstone from a quarry in Virginia was laid and the President's House became the oldest federal building in Washington. President and Mrs. John Adams were the first occupants of the three-story mansion in November of 1800. By 1809 the President's House was called the White House because its whitish limestone walls contrasted with the redbrick buildings around it. In 1818 the House was painted white and officially became known as the White House.

BUTTERMILK CORN BREAD

- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 cup cornmeal
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1½ cups buttermilk
- 2 eggs
- ¼ cup vegetable oil
- ¼ cup brown sugar



Combine flour, cornmeal, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. In a separate bowl whisk together remaining ingredients until smooth and add to the flour mixture. Pour into a greased 9-inch square pan and bake at 400° F for about 20 minutes, until golden brown. Serve warm.

Preparation for planting small grains should include applying lime to assure proper soil pH. Soil tests can help you determine your liming needs...

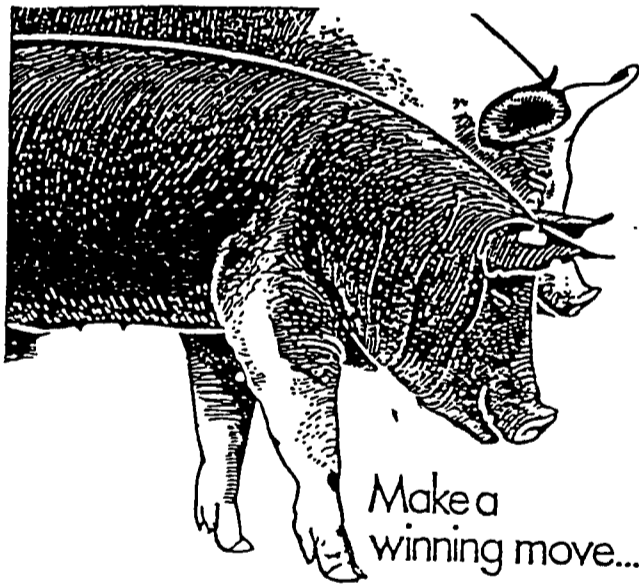
